Use of Pupil Premium 2019-20

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. In 2019-20 this also included pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as 'Ever Six FSM').

For 2019-20 Furzefield Primary was funded £170,540 for Pupil Premium. The following table illustrates how we have used the additional funding to support pupils from low income families;
