Ocean / Year Five

Spring Term

Maths

We will be developing our recognition of number and counting forwards and backwards, and will also be looking at place value and what value each digit represents.

We will continue to work on addition and subtraction, and link this to multiplying, dividing and fractions.

We will also be learning about money and time.

Practical activities and opportunities will help develop mathematical vocabulary.

How you can help at home:

Count aloud forward and backwards.

Look for numbers in real life situations e.g. bus numbers, car registration plates, when out shopping.

Familiarise your child with recognising coins.

Talk about the time, dates and seasons.

English

Science

This term in Science, we will be learning all about the Earth and Space and changes of materials. We will learn about the geocentric and heliocentric models of our Solar System. Our science lessons are always very exciting as we love to conduct experiments and be as practical as possible.

How you can help at home:

Why not help us research our favourite planet? Or even monitor the changes of the moon during the lunar cycle? You could even share your own knowledge of the stars with us.



History

This term we are learning History linked with the Victorians. This will include how people lived, differences and similarities through time and key events in history that have impacted our lives today. We will even be spending the day as a Victorian child on our trip to Guildford, during Topic Week in February.

How you can help at home: Why not help us research the different inventions the Victorians created? You could even talk to us about how technology has developed further over the years.
