<u>PE Kit</u>

PE kits will not be needed until after Christmas. If you want to buy kit ready for next term, your child will need a pair a black shorts and a yellow t-shirt. These can be purchased from the school office.

PLEASE MAKE SURE ALL UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT IS CLEARLY MARKED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.

Please make sure that children do not have jewellery in school—this includes earrings.

Mathematics

We will be focusing on number this term and will be learning number songs and will begin with recognising number to 10+. We will sort, write and count as well as play games with these numbers. To help at home you could look for numbers on packaging or talk about your house number.

Physical development

Write Dance will focus on feelings and Autumn. The children will also spend time over this half term exploring the areas around reception.



To help at home you could go for a colour walk – looking for colours in the world around you. You could also talk to your child about what they have done that day and how they are feeling as the term progresses.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

We will be ensuring that the children understand and follow the new routines that

develop with school life. We will also talk about school rules and explore the similarities and differences between home and school. We will also look at changes that Autumn brings and discuss why this happens.



To help at home you could ensure that routines are in place and talk about why these are important.
