Curriculum Information

Year Five

Spring Term

English



This term we will be learning all about The Highwayman and writing for persuasion. We will be discovering how to write engaging and emotive poems, letters, diary entries, arguments and newspaper articles. Additionally, we will be securing our understanding of vocabulary, sentence structure, use of punctuation and spelling.

How you can help at home:

Please support this learning at home by reading daily with your child and asking them key questions about the text. For example, what do you think will happen next? Who is your favourite character? Why?

Maths



This term in Maths we will be developing our understanding and confidence when working with multiples, prime numbers and factors. We will also be learning about fractions, decimals, percentages. When focussing on shape (Geometry) we are going to learn about translation, rotation and reflection.

How you can help at home:

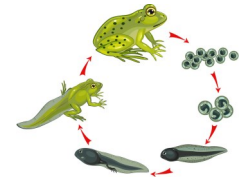
You can support this learning by practicing the times tables regularly and allowing your child to access weekly tasks on Mathletics.

Science

This term in Science, we will be learning all about Living Things and their Habitats. We will learning about the different lifecycles of plants and animals and categorising living things where possible. Our science lessons are always very exciting as we love to conduct experiments and be as practical as possible.

History

This term we are learning History linked with the Victorians. This will include how people lived, differences and similarities through time and key events in history that have impacted our lives today. We will even be spending the day as a Victorian child on our trip to Guildford.

How you can help at home: Why not help us research the different inventions the Victorians created? You could even talk to us about how technology has developed further over the years.

Geography

This term, our Geography lessons will be linked with our History. Alongside these lessons, we will be developing our mapping skills in our Forest School sessions.

RE

This term we are going to be learning about the beliefs and traditions within Christianity. We will be learning about sacred texts, buildings and festivals. We will also be attending the Easter Experience in Reigate.

Computing
