The Foundation Stage

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
- The Foundation Stage is from the beginning of Nursery to the end of Reception.
- We follow the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum. Where children will be working towards the Early Learning Goals.
- The Early Years Curriculum is an individualised, play-based curriculum which allows the adults to observe and find out about children's interests and what they are able to do independently across a broad range of areas.
- Planned and purposeful activities both indoors and outdoors with a mixture of adult led and child initiated learning.
- Individual records (Learning journals) are kept by staff to record the activities your child participates in and undertakes, as well as their progress in specific skills.





Areas of development in Reception











Communication, language and

literacy

- The ability to communicate allows children to participate more fully in society;
- To imagine and recreate experiences;
- To love books, stories, rhymes;
- > To find things out.
- Phonics is a very important part of this.
- There will be a meeting in the first half term to explain how we teach phonics.







- Each half term, we centre our learning around a topic.
- Parents are given information about each topic and suggestions for how you can support your child's learning at home.
- Topics this year have included: celebrations, people who help us and superhero's.

Playtimes

- Children have daily access to our outside area.
- They join other children on the playground after lunch.
- Reception staff work on the playground and in the lunch hall.
- If we feel it is necessary, we will mark out an area of playground just for reception children until they are more confident.

Lunch times

> Lunch times can be stressful for some young children.

We will help by:

- Making sure the children go into a quiet lunch hall before any other children arrive.
- Supervising the children ourselves at lunchtime.
- Cordoning off an area of the playground for a few weeks if it necessary.
- Friendly kitchen staff who are very good at learning the children's names and likes and dislikes.

You can help by:

- Teaching your child to use a knife and fork.
- Encouraging your child to try a wide range of different foods.



- Read every day with your child.
- Establish morning and bedtime routines.
- You will receive a photo information pack with pictures of staff and of the reception classrooms and outdoor area. Please use this to talk to your child about school before they start.
- > Buy the uniform together.
- Be positive!

- > Start of the day is 8.40am (registration will begin at 8.50am)
- ➤ Please say goodbye in whatever way you usually would.
- If a child is ever very upset in the morning, we will call to reassure you once they have settled.

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We want to work together with you to make your child's year successful.


- > We hold regular meetings with you to discuss progress.


