Year 4 Curriculum Information Leaflet—Spring Term 2023



English

We will be focussing on three themes this term; myths and legends, non-fiction reports and poetry.



Myths and Legends

Through our history topic of the Mayans we will be looking at legends, myths, hieroglyphics and using questioning. We will also be researching and presenting facts.

<u>Poetry</u>

The children will be learning about the specific features of shape poems.

We will also be looking at handwriting and spellings. Children will be encouraged to use joined handwriting and experiment with adventurous vocabulary. Every day in class we will have guided reading. We will use a range of texts and activities to practice our inference and deduction skills.

How you can help at home:

Read a variety of texts together regularly. Support your child with Reading Eggs. Be an audience for your child's story telling.

Maths

We will be focussing on these areas of learning this term: place value, sequences, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, shape and space, fractions and word problems. We will continue to talk about the 'Multiplication tables check' that will take place in the summer term 2023.

How you can help at home:

Regular work on times tables, including Times table Rockstars. Support your child with Mathletics. Pokemaths tests will take place every Tuesday in school.

Science

States of Matter: The children will be comparing and grouping materials together, according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.

Sound: The children will be identifying how sounds are made, recognising that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear. Finding patterns between pitch of a sound and features of the object that it produced it.

<u>How you can help at home</u>: Identify sound spots, focussing on vibration and pitch.



PE

PE topics. We will be learning some dance skills linked to our topic on Greeks and learning the skills needed to take part in orienteering.

How you can help at home:

Your child will need to wear their PE kits on Monday and Friday. Ensure that your child has the appropriate kit, especially suitable shoes and warm clothing for outdoor lessons.



History and Cross Curricular learning

Our topic this term is the ancient civilisation of the Mayans. We will look at all aspects of their life and culture. This will include farming, their beliefs, housing, ancient artefacts and daily life. We will also have some forest school sessions based on the Mayans (more information to follow).

<u>How you can help at home</u>: Watch programmes on the Ancient civilisations of the Mayans, look for information in books and on the internet.

Computing

We will revisit issues of online safety at regular occasions. We will be improving our Word processing skills and applying these skills across the curriculum. We will also use the internet to research our history and English topics. We will start to look at coding during this term.

<u>How you can help at home</u>: Discuss online safety with your child. You can also log on to purple mash at home and try some of the activities.



RE

We will look at the ways in which people try to make the world a fairer place for the first half of the term. We will also be learning about Christians, in particular if communion is an act of celebration or remembrance?

How you can help at home:

Discuss with your child the main events of Easter.

Music

We will continue our musical journey using Glockenspiels. We will explore the rhythm and tempo of music while joining in with popular songs.

How you can help at home:

Listen to different types of music and try to clap along with the beat.

PSHE

Our values this term are responsibility & honesty and peace & freedom. We will talk about the rights of the child, and why telling the truth is difficult but important. We will be introducing 'No Outsiders' into our PSHE lessons through a series of picture books and assemblies.

How you can help at home:

Use the local and national news to discuss current affairs.
