

Year 5 Curriculum Information Leaflet—Summer Term



English

This term we investing Graffiti and learning about and positive and negative ideas around graffiti. We will learn about the life and style of some



of the graffiti artists who have inspired others by their work. We will be learning how to write non-chronological reports, balance arguments and persuasive writing. Additionally, we will be securing our understanding of vocabulary, sentence structure, using paragraphs and frontal adverbials.

<u>Maths</u>

This term in Maths we will continue to develop our understanding and confidence when working with number in-



cluding square, cube and prime numbers. We will also be learning about word and reasoning problems.

Science

This term in Science, we will be learning all about life cycles and habitats. We will be identifying the differences between the life cycle of an insect, mammal and flower.

How you can help at home:


Why not help us by exploring animal or plant life cycles at home.

History

This term we are going to be learning about the Indus Valley Civilisation. Children will learn where the first civilisations were located and why they were located along rivers.
