Curriculum Information Year Four Autumn Term

English

We will be focussing on three themes this term; fantasy fiction, non-chronological report and poetry.



Storytelling

The children will study the story of 'Fortunately the Milk' and use that format to write a story of their own. This is a very successful and exciting way to improve story writing.

Poetry

The children will be learning about the specific features of shape poems.

We will also be looking at handwriting and spellings. Children will be encouraged to use joined handwriting and experiment with adventurous vocabulary.

How you can help at home:

Read a variety of texts together regularly. Support your child with Reading Express. Be an audience for your child's story telling.

Maths

We will be focussing on these areas of learning this term: place value, sequences, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, shape and space, fractions and word problems.



We will also be learning Roman numerals, shape, measure and time. We will start to talk about the 'Multiplication tables check' that will take place in the summer term 2023.

How you can help at home:

Support your child to learn their tables, including using Times Table Rock Stars and Mathletics,

Science

Electricity

The children will be identifying appliances that run on electricity, constructing circuits, recognising some common conductors and insulators and begin to use switches.

Sound

To identify how sounds are made and vibrate through the ear.

How you can help at home:

Discuss electrical safety together.



PE

In school we will be learning some basic gymnastics moves, running and playing hockey.

How you can help at home:

Ensure that your child has the appropriate kit in school. Let us know of any outside sporting achievements so we can celebrate them in school.



Topic learning

We will be covering a variety of themes through learning about our class country. These include; locating other countries, continents and researching human and physical features. Later in the term we will also look at volcanoes, mountains and earthquakes.

How you can help at home: Investigate maps together.

Explore different Asian countries through research, books, films and TV programmes.



Computing

We will revisit issues of online safety at regular occasions. We will be improving our Word processing skills and applying these skills across the curriculum.

How you can help at home: Discuss online safety with your child. You can also log on to purple mash at home and try some of the activities.



RE

We will be learning about Judaism and Christianity. Our learning in RE will also support the special events of Harvest and the Christmas.

How you can help at home:

Discuss family celebrations, traditions and festivals.

PSHE

Our values this term are co-operation and unity. We will talk about working together and how we can be good team players. Working in our class bubbles we will discuss keeping each other and ourselves safe. We will also be using videos to discuss different emotions.
